Dear Ms. Wiggins,

The mission of Metro's Sustainability Council is to advise the agency on ways to improve sustainability efforts by developing targets, metrics and strategies to assist Metro in achieving its stated sustainability program goals.

We recently became aware of the Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA) Roadway Improvements Project, part of the larger Airfield and Terminal Modernization Project (ATMP). This project would dramatically expand the roadway infrastructure around LAX, constructing or replacing 4.4 miles of roadway.

While the project is not warranted based on the merits (traffic into the central terminal area is down, and LAX's new terminals are on hold), we are concerned that this \$1.5B project may undermine Metro's own efforts.

LAX has spent \$3.3B on the automated people mover, which in their own estimations will move 30 million passengers each year, about $\frac{1}{3}$ of LAX's total volume. Of course, the people mover will connect to Metro's new Airport station, which cost Metro \$900M; Metro's multibillion dollar investments in the future C and K line extensions, and the opening of Metro's D line extension, will entice more passengers to take Metro to and from LAX.

Unfortunately, similar to the 405 expansion 20 years ago that made traffic worse¹, LAWA's new roadways are likely to do the same. In fact, in their own environmental impact report, the new roadways are expected to induce 51,006 more daily vehicle miles traveled²; according to a supplemental report by LADOT, the project is expected to make traffic around the airport worse overall.

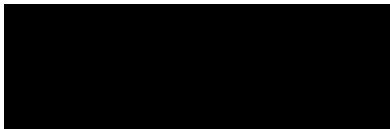

As a region, spending billions to connect multiple rail lines to our airport only to have the airport itself undertake a project that induces more people to drive is counterproductive, directly undermining the huge effort and expense Metro has made on improving public transportation to the airport.

Lastly, L.A. is gearing up to host the World Cup next year, and the Olympics in 2028. The automated people mover was expected to open in 2023 — and is now expected to open in the summer of 2026, more than three years late. It does not make sense to tear up the roadways around our airport this close to events that will put Los Angeles on the world stage, as this project will likely face similar delays.

Given how misaligned this project is with our region's sustainability efforts and Metro's own transit investments, we suggest that Metro work with the City of Los Angeles to put this project on hold until after the Olympics, where we can reassess if a massive roadway expansion still makes sense.

Congestion is projected to worsen by 30% in 2045. The Project will create a fast and reliable transportation option to connect people by rail to jobs, schools, and services across the County with benefits concentrated in many Equity Focus Communities that will be linked along the Metro C and K Lines.

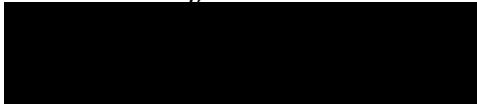

Dear Ms. Duong:

I am writing to protest the award of RFP no. OP91160 (3) – Graffiti Abatement Services and my teams previous determination of non – responsiveness. My team and I were surprised by this determination, as we believe we satisfied all stated requirements of the RFP.

Our submittal was deemed non-responsive because Far East Landscape and Maintenance, Inc. is not certified under the NAICS code for Pressure Washing and Steam Cleaning Services. However, our firm is certified under a different NAICS code and therefore qualifies under the RFP’s requirement for certification as a Small Business Enterprise (SBE). The RFP does not specify that the SBE must be certified under the NAICS code specific to graffiti abatement services. In addition, our subcontractor holds the relevant licensing and expertise required to perform these services.

The RFP also requires that the certified SBE perform a Commercially Useful Function of at least 30%. Far East Landscape and Maintenance, Inc. meets this requirement. For your reference, I have attached a breakdown of the contract work that will be performed directly by our team, including tasks directly related to graffiti abatement and other associated responsibilities.


We believe that this type of strategic partnership—with a firm that holds specific technical expertise—offers a unique opportunity for our small business to gain practical experience in a new area of service. This supports the intended purpose of Metro’s SBE set-aside program: to expand the capabilities and participation of small, minority-owned firms. By enabling such firms to participate meaningfully alongside more experienced subcontractors, Metro strengthens its commitment to inclusion, mentorship, and capacity-building across the contracting community.

Additionally, we would appreciate clarification regarding the procurement procedure used. Under California Public Utilities Code Section 130232(f)(5) et seq., small business set-aside contracts are to be awarded to the "lowest responsible bidder." This language appears to suggest that an Invitation for Bids (IFB) would be the appropriate vehicle, rather than a Request for Proposals (RFP). In an RFP process, "non-responsiveness" is not typically a disqualifying factor, as the process allows for discussions and revised proposals.

I have no reservations that my team could provide exemplary service had we been allowed to continue the award process.

Dear Chair Dutra and LA Metro Board Members,

I am writing to request clarity, transparency, and accountability regarding the status and outcomes of the Agency Enterprise Security Architecture Assessment authorized under Board Report 2022-0511, dated September 15, 2022. As you know, LA Metro awarded a \$1,259,400 contract to Regents & Park to conduct this assessment with the intent of strengthening Metro's cybersecurity posture across its vast and interdependent system.

More than three years later, no public update has been provided on the assessment's findings, recommendations, or implementation progress. In that time, several developments highlight significant security concerns:

1. Metro is acquiring 64 CRRC rail cars, with deliveries extending through 2027. Federal agencies have repeatedly raised concerns regarding cybersecurity vulnerabilities associated with foreign-manufactured rolling stock, particularly systems produced by companies with ties to the Chinese government. Without clear, published cybersecurity integration measures, it remains unknown what steps LA Metro has taken to protect railcar software, onboard communication systems, or control interfaces.
2. Just last month, Metro's digital signage was hacked by online activists, showing that unauthorized actors can penetrate Metro's digital infrastructure. While the incident was contained, it raises critical

questions about whether other operational systems—including those controlling train movement—are equally vulnerable.

3. With the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games approaching, Metro will be a primary transportation artery for the world's largest sporting event. This reality elevates Metro's visibility as a target for cyber intrusion, operational disruption, or attacks designed to create cascading operational failures.

These concerns prompt essential questions about Metro's cybersecurity readiness. Does LA Metro have a fully operational, independently validated cybersecurity plan capable of protecting riders, employees, operations, and critical infrastructure from digital and kinetic threats?

Of particular concern is the issue of staffing. Every major transportation agency relies on highly trained cybersecurity personnel to identify vulnerabilities, oversee system hardening, and respond to incidents in real time. To properly evaluate Metro's readiness, the public must understand:

- How many full-time, non-contracted cybersecurity professionals does LA Metro currently employ?
- How does this staffing level compare to transportation agencies of comparable size and prominence, such as New York MTA, Washington Metro, BART, and Chicago CTA?

Cybersecurity is not a function that can be outsourced entirely or addressed intermittently. Agencies operating complex operational technology environments, including train control, SCADA networks, vehicle systems, and public-facing digital assets, typically employ entire cybersecurity divisions. If Metro is operating with significantly fewer dedicated personnel, the Board and the public deserve to understand the implications.

Furthermore, I respectfully request the following:

1. What were the findings of the Regents & Park Enterprise Security Architecture Assessment, and what is the implementation status of those recommendations?
2. Has Metro conducted independent penetration testing on its rail vehicles—including the new CRRC cars—and all operational systems they interact with?
3. What is Metro's contingency plan for a kinetic incident resulting from a cyberattack, such as a collision or derailment?
4. Has the Board received regular cybersecurity readiness updates? If not, why not?
5. How is cybersecurity insurance expected to protect riders and frontline employees in the event of a real-time attack, given that insurance only mitigates financial losses after the fact?

The safety of millions of riders, the integrity of our regional transportation network, and the global reputation of Los Angeles during the 2028 Games depend on Metro's ability to anticipate and neutralize high-consequence threats. The public deserves assurance that Metro is not merely checking regulatory boxes but is proactively building a cybersecurity capability that matches the scale of its risk.

Thank you for your attention to these urgent issues. I look forward to your response and to meaningful transparency regarding the cybersecurity posture of LA Metro.

The Hybrid Locally Preferred Alternative is a fully grade-separated, community-supported solution that modernizes an aging freight corridor, improves safety and noise conditions, and provides a direct under-20-minute ride from Redondo Beach and Torrance to LAX. It is supported by numerous businesses, organizations, and officials across the South Bay. It strengthens regional connections to jobs, housing, education, and communities along the K Line while improving first-last mile mobility. This project delivers on a Measure M promise, addresses community concerns, and brings 15,000 jobs and 1.5 million new riders to the region while remaining highly cost-effective. The project has been studied for decades, with extensive refinement in the FEIR, and the LPA will be fully competitive for additional state funding.

Nearly \$1.4 billion is already secured—over 50% of total costs—putting it ahead of other Metro rail projects at FEIR certification. No major rail project is fully funded before EIR approval; certification is what unlocks additional grants and creates a shovel-ready project. I am writing to strongly urge the South Bay Cities Council of Governments (SBCCOG) and Metro Board to oppose the Metro Right of Way (ROW) Hybrid option and to not certify the FEIR.

This email is in support of the Green Line/C-Line/K-Line Hawthorne Blvd Alignment option.

I fully support the Hawthorne Blvd option because it would not further divide destroy neighborhood communities in Lawndale and Redondo Beach.

The Hawthorne Blvd option is also the most cost effective with the highest ridership projected by Metro. The Hawthorne Blvd option would be closer to El Camino College with better connection opportunities for students and community members, along with potential housing development opportunities under SB79 in the Galleria Mall area around the intersection of Hawthorne Blvd and Artesia.

The light rail train will have greater public visibility and awareness to help drive transit at this location also. The SBCCOG should instead offer support of the Hawthorne Blvd project option.

I want to see a high quality project built. I believe Improved public transit is a critical resource for Los Angeles County and Southern California and a key part of California State climate goals. It is important that this project be built correctly the first time and in a timely manner.

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Dear Members of the Metro Board,

I'm writing both as an employee of the City of Los Angeles and as a DTLA Resident of the past 10+ years Angeleno who wants a transit system that is safe, clean, and reliable for the people who depend on it every day. Today nearly **46% of riders enter without paying**—about **12 million unpaid boardings each month**. Despite having **200 Transit Security Officers**, Metro issues **fewer than 10 citations a day**, meaning fare enforcement has effectively been suspended since the pandemic without any public Board decision. This has helped drive Metro's farebox recovery from **25% down to 7%**, even though adjusting fares for inflation and restoring enforcement could generate **\$176 million more annually**—enough to increase bus service by 12–15% or bring back frequent evening rail service.

This is also a safety issue. **Over 90% of crimes on Metro are committed by riders who have not paid**, and no security force can respond to crimes in real time across the system. What *does* work is deterrence. Before 2017, LASD easily checked around **20,000 TAP cards a day** with just 108 dedicated staff, keeping fare evasion in the single digits. Metro could achieve the same goal today by asking each TSO to perform roughly **140 inspections per shift**.

Equity arguments should support enforcement, not undermine it. Everyone making under **\$53,000 already receives 20 free rides a month**, and citations do **not** create criminal records. Metro also has the authority to offer community service. Right now, an unsecure system disproportionately harms low-income riders who rely on it most. And Metro's own surveys show that riders consistently prioritize safety, cleanliness, and functioning security over almost anything else—they are asking the Board to fix this.

Proof-of-payment with citations is the global standard, and Metro already has the staff and legal authority to reinstate it immediately. Please restore systematic, unbiased fare enforcement so that paying the fare—and respecting the system—once again becomes the norm. That's how we create the safe, functional, and well-funded transit system working Angelenos deserve. It is important that the Metro system is able to serve Angelenos from

all backgrounds; getting to the point where riders are from different socioeconomic backgrounds and use the system not as a necessity, but because it is a convenient and reliable option, is extremely important. Shifting the culture around public transportation prior to the Olympics is key in order for the Olympics and World Cup events to go smoothly.

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Dear Honorable Metro Board Members,

I'm writing because I ride Metro regularly, and I've watched the system change in ways that don't feel good for riders. At this point almost half the people getting on aren't paying—about 46%, or 12 million unpaid boardings every month. And somehow, with 200 Transit Security Officers, Metro is giving out fewer than ten citations a day. To most of us who use the system, it looks like fare enforcement just quietly disappeared during the pandemic and never came back.

This has real consequences. Metro's fare revenue has dropped to a tiny fraction of what it once was—7% instead of 25%—and that's money that could be going into more frequent bus service or bringing back normal evening rail schedules. If Metro simply updated fares for inflation and enforced them again, it could gain roughly \$176 million a year. That's not pocket change; it's the difference between a system people trust and one they avoid.

Safety is tied directly to this. Over 90% of crimes on Metro are committed by people who didn't pay the fare. No amount of security staffing can chase down every incident as it happens, but having actual fare inspections creates deterrence. Before 2017, LASD was checking around 20,000 TAP cards daily, and fare evasion stayed low. Metro could hit that same level again—about 140 inspections per officer per shift.

And this isn't about punishing low-income riders. Anyone making under \$53,000 already gets 20 free rides a month, and citations don't create criminal records. Metro can even offer community service in place of fines. What's inequitable is the current reality: people who rely on transit the most are forced into an environment that doesn't feel safe or predictable.

Metro surveys show riders are asking --loudly-- for safety, cleanliness, and security that actually works. These things aren't luxuries. They're the baseline of a transit system people can rely on.

Please bring back real, consistent fare enforcement. Metro already has the staff and the authority to do it now. Riders deserve a system with rules that are actually followed and a level of safety that lets us travel without anxiety.

I implore the Planning and Programming Committee to reconsider the recommendations to Agenda Item #2025-0842 made during the November 19, 2025 Regular Metro Board meeting approving of the Westbound State Route 91 - Alondra to Shoemaker Improvement Project. The planned widening of the already heavily-used corridor will induce further demand and negate the purported benefits mentioned in the proposal. Reputed city planner Jeff Speck has called induced demand "the great intellectual black hole in city planning, the one professional certainty that every thoughtful person seems to acknowledge, yet almost no one is willing to act upon," (2012).

The planned widening of the State Route 91 between Alondra and Shoemaker will encourage vehicular use and traffic rather than address the issue of traffic. Rather than investing finite financial resources towards public transportation and facilitating community-first sustainable transportation options, the Metro Board instead chooses to focus finite resources on unsustainable options that harm local communities and ignore road maintenance of existing roadways. With the upcoming 2026 World Cup and 2028 Summer Olympics, investing the Project funds into frequent, reliable transit connections between Los Angeles, Orange, and Riverside counties, such as intercity rail and bus services, can greatly benefit local communities and commuters in reducing socioeconomic and physical health stressors through increased transit connectivity and reduced car dependence.

YES (AND ALSO CONSIDER THE BENEFITS & POSSIBILITIES FOR METRO)**

I am writing to all the elected officials who represent my area on the Metro Board, to SUPPORT the LA-ART, also known as the "Dodger Stadium gondola."

I understand the concerns with some members of Metro and the City of LA that this is not the answer and that there needs to be more done. However, please consider the following:

1. This is going to be built by private funds and no taxpayer dollars will be used
2. Trees will be replanted in a 4:1 ratio on their dime so it's a win overall
3. **There is an opportunity here for Metro to gain something that will help fund Dodger Stadium Express and perhaps even more future transportation alternatives to Dodger Stadium.**

I would like to focus on the third part. One of the concerns raised by Supervisor Hahn was that she wanted more consideration to expanding Dodger Stadium Express (DSE) and have the Dodgers help fund them. I agree with that also. However, I would consider that the supporting both the gondola and the DSE can be mutual with the right approach.

Consider the following proposal:

- Metro currently has lots of old, used turnstiles as they are replacing with the newer fare gates. That means Metro can "donate" these older turnstiles to the gondola project to help the gondola save costs.
- By donating these old turnstiles, the gondola then can be integrated into our TAP system and since these turnstiles can also read QR codes, that can also be done should the gondola decide to use a QR code system like Metrolink does.
- In return, Metro can strike a deal with the gondola project to ask for a "profit sharing" proposal where a small percentage of gondola fares can go back to Metro to help fund the DSE and future projects to Dodger Stadium, such as bus lanes, perhaps even a future subway station. If the non-profit Angel's Flight can be part of our TAP card system, I don't see why not a privately funded/operated Dodger gondola cannot either.
- Since the gondola is a private project, we can also test the idea of whether our TAP system can handle a potential move to distance based fares. For example, will there be a difference between fares from

Alameda station to Dodger Stadium Station as opposed to the shorter Chinatown/State Park Station to Dodger Stadium Station? (see attached map)

These ideas are definitely worth looking into as a proposal to help bring another "fun and unique" way to get around to LA. Furthermore, if the water taxi proposal supported by Supervisor Hahn is a "fun and unique" way to get around, I don't see why not a gondola shouldn't be either. Rather, I'd like to even see the water taxi proposal not just be between San Pedro and Long Beach, but to other places in LA. I would even love to see a LAX air-to-ferry port being built at Dockweiler State Beach where we can help reduce the need for small commuter regional jets at LAX to places like SBA and SAN and instead be replaced with LAX plane to connecting turbojet fast ferries between Santa Barbara and San Diego. Face it, California High Speed Rail isn't going to be built in Southern California for decades, and even if it did, it still will not go near LAX, so a turbojet fast ferry option that can seat 300-400 passengers should be explored to link nearby cities that can help reduce the need of those commuter regional jets to places like Santa Barbara and San Diego.

However, going back to the water taxi and the gondola, I believe both should be added into our transit system, both also integrated into our TAP system, which would help create jobs and new unique markets that help define the character of LA that we're not afraid to try and do new things.

But if we say no to these things, we will also lose these opportunities like TAP integration, profit sharing, and bringing in added long term funding that will help strengthen existing and future transit projects.

Summary:

- Consider donating our older turnstiles to the gondola as we replace them with the newer faregates
- Consider integrating the Dodger gondola into our TAP system
- Consider working out a deal that with the above in exchange, Metro can receive a small percentage of revenues that will help fund Dodger Stadium Express and other future projects to Dodger Stadium

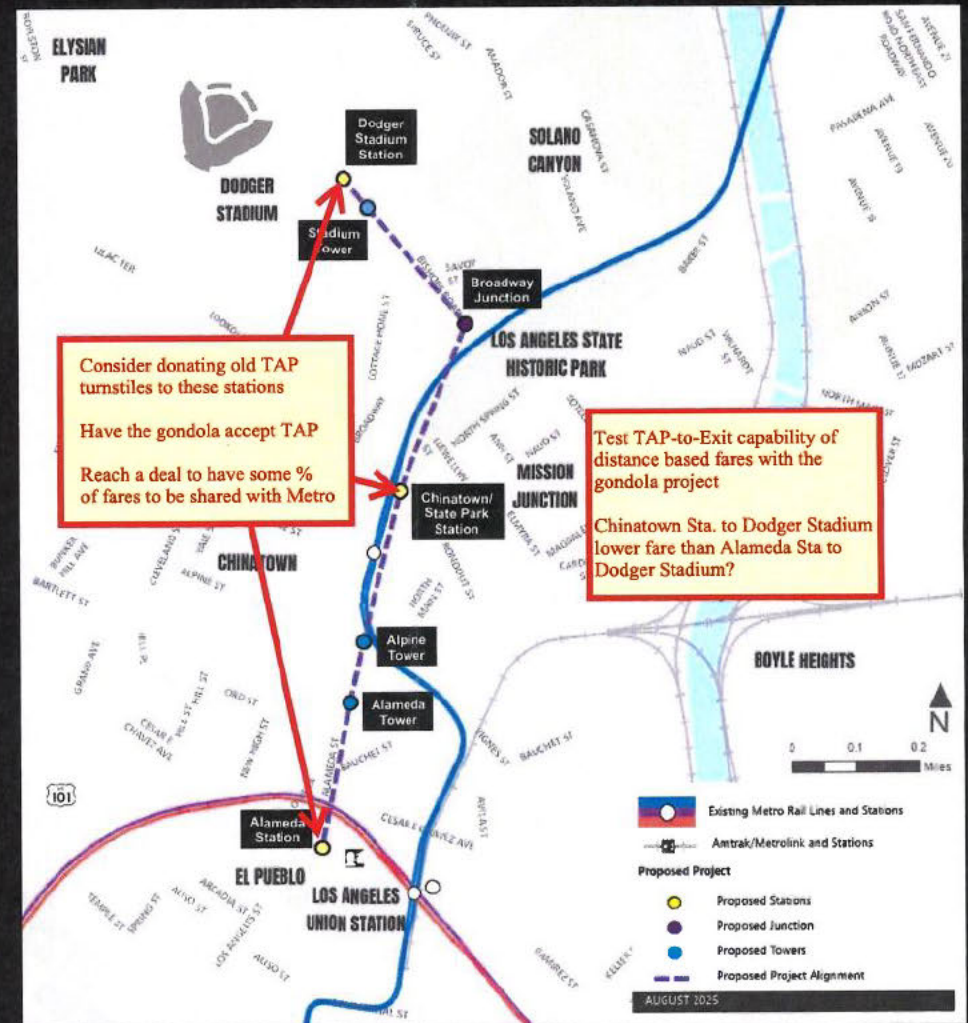
Anything can be worked out, such as what that percentage is or how long this relationship will be, etc. But we can't do these things if we say no to it. Let's make some compromise and look farther ahead to what long term opportunities and partnerships can be made between Metro and the gondola. And if this becomes successful, perhaps this can help convince other private industries and sports teams to work with Metro with other projects such as the Downtown LA Streetcar and the Inglewood Tram.

As City Councilmember for the Thirteenth District of the City of Los Angeles, representing parts of Echo Park and Elysian Park, I write in opposition to Item 16, the Environmental Impact Report for the Los Angeles Aerial Rapid Transit project.

The Los Angeles City Council has already adopted a resolution opposing certification of this EIR, and I'd like to briefly outline the reasoning behind my opposition.

First, we need to center the voices of the communities who live around this project. The residents of Chinatown, Solano Canyon, Echo Park, and Elysian Park have been clear about their concerns. I'm here alongside Councilmembers Jurado and Hernandez, who represent these neighborhoods directly and have expressed the same. We have a duty to listen to them.

We also can't ignore the context that shapes how these neighborhoods view large projects. Places like Chávez Ravine remind us what happens when government decisions advance private interests at the expense of working-class communities. Our residents should be skeptical when public land and public resources are proposed for a privately driven concept.

This painful history is critical here, because I am not opposed to public transit. I am not opposed to improving the speed and safety of visitors to Dodger Stadium. And I am not opposed to gondolas.

What I'm opposed to is the way this private transit project has had its path smoothed. A wealthy individual proposed a project that will only benefit a tiny fraction of gameday attendees using private transit. Then, we suddenly see individuals willing to flex their political capital to skip steps in review, impact public lands, and further concentrate effects on residents in historically marginalized communities.

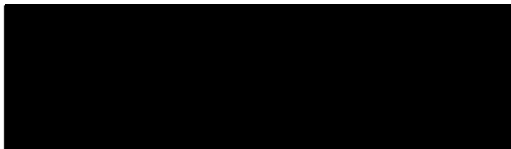

Honorable Metro Board Members:

This comment letter on the Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (*Final SEIR or FSEIR*) and other recently released documents associated with the Los Angeles Aerial Rapid Transit Project (*Project*) is submitted on behalf of Los Angeles Parks Alliance (*LAPA*). LAPA adopts and incorporates by reference all comments and objections raised by others during the entire administrative process for the environmental review and related approvals before the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (*Metro*) for the Project.

LAPA urges the Metro board to set aside the Project EIR and previous approvals, to reject certification of the EIR as supplemented, and to deny all Project approvals.

Metro's cursory process evidences a precommitment to Project approval.

LAPA objects to the process by which Metro has hastily pushed re-consideration of the Project's inadequate environmental review through its decision-making machinery, which strongly evinces Metro's precommitment to approving the Project's environmental review document. Not even a week after the comment period on its Draft SEIR had closed on November 13, 2025, with more than 950 written comments and 89 public meeting comments (FSEIR, p. 7), Metro published its Final SEIR with responses to most of these comments the afternoon of November 19, 2025. LAPA received notice through counsel at 3:25pm.¹

The item was scheduled for consideration by Metro’s Executive Management Committee the very next morning (November 20) at 11am. Per Metro’s hearing rules provided on the committee agenda, written submissions from the public were to be provided no later than 5pm the afternoon of November 19. No interested person or entity, including LAPA, could reasonably be thought to have sufficient time to both review the 215-page Final SEIR and then provide a written comment to the Executive Management Committee on the item before the 5pm deadline, or even sufficient time to craft meaningful comments on the Project documentation the next morning.

Not that the committee appeared to be seeking meaningful comments: the Executive Management Committee Chair provided only 30 seconds per person to each commenter, barely enough time for speakers to state their name and whether they were generally for or against the project. Metro’s own policy is to provide a 30-day period for review of its written responses and final environmental documents, but conveniently and unconvincingly claims that policy does not apply to its review of the Project. (FSEIR, pp. 80-81.) Nowhere in Metro’s online policy does Metro explain it applies only to projects with a joint state and federal environmental review processes that utilize both an EIR and EIS.²

Metro ignores the Court’s order to set aside project approvals and is simply re-approving the existing EIR with inadequate supplemental review.

As previously discussed, Metro trades on the fiction that the Court of Appeal affirmed the trial court’s original judgment in part, stating numerous times that “the Court of Appeal affirmed in part and reversed in part the Superior Court’s judgment.” (DSEIR, p. 3; see LAPA DSEIR comment letter, pp. 2-4.) But the Court did nothing of the sort—the word “affirmed” and the phrases “affirmed in part” and “reversed in part” are not found anywhere in the Court of Appeal’s decision. The FSEIR doubles down on this false narrative and explains away the grossly misleading language as somehow helpful to the public: “This phrasing reflects the practical outcome of the litigation and summarizes the decision in a way that is *clear and accessible to the general public*.” (FSEIR, p. 30.) This linguistic gamesmanship is the sort of up-is-down double-speak that significantly undermines public trust and confidence in Metro’s decision-making process.

As our Supreme Court has held:

The EIR is... intended “to demonstrate to an apprehensive citizenry that the agency has, in fact, analyzed and considered the ecological implications of its action.” [Citations.] Because the EIR must be certified or rejected by public officials, it is a

document of accountability. If CEQA is scrupulously followed, the public will know the basis on which its responsible officials either approve or reject environmentally significant action, and the public, being duly informed, can respond accordingly to action with which it disagrees. [Citations.] The EIR process protects not only the environment but also informed self-government.

(Laurel Heights Improvement Assn. v. Regents of University of California (1988) 47 Cal.3d 376, 392.)

Metro's prevarications evidence an effort to limit the scope of comments considered on the Final SEIR, but neither the Court of Appeal nor the trial court on remand provided an order permitting Metro to use a so-called limited writ.

Metro's administrative process likewise misconstrues the direction of the Court of Appeal and the judgment recently entered in both the *LAPA v. Metro* and *TCE v. Metro* cases. As agendas for the November 20, 2025, Executive Management Committee hearing and the December 4, 2025, regular board hearing show, Metro's process will, in one vote, set aside the previously certified EIR and related approvals and in the very same instant re-approve the same document as supplemented by the inadequate Final Supplemental EIR. Not for one moment will the previous EIR and approvals have been set aside.

LAPA objects to Metro's procedural gamesmanship, which is further evidence of its precommitment to approve the Project.

Metro's Executive Management Committee recommended Project approval without considering all public comments or Project documents, including newly proposed mitigations from responding public agencies.

Metro's FSEIR did not respond to five public comment letters. Citing (but not explaining) "technological issues" Metro published an "Errata to the Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Report" late in the afternoon on November 24 to provide the written responses mandated by CEQA Guidelines section 15088(a).³ This was well *after* the Executive Management Committee considered and voted on the item on November 20, meaning neither they nor interested members of the public had the opportunity to review the comments or Metro's required responses to them.

The final comment letters addressed in the FSEIR include two from public agencies: Los Angeles Unified School District’s Office of Environmental Health, and Safety, and Los Angeles City Councilmember Ysabel Jurado (Council District 14). The LAUSD letter provided a list of comprehensive concerns regarding environmental effects on students and residents and made specific recommendations to mitigate these effects. (FSEIR Errata, pp. 19-22.) Metro’s response shockingly criticizes LAUSD for not previously participating in the environmental review process for the Project and then repeatedly declares LAUSD’s comments are “Outside the Scope of the SEIR.” (*Id.*, pp. 2, 5, 7, 8, 10.)

LAPA and others have elsewhere strongly criticized Metro’s contention that the Court of Appeal decision calls for a so-called limited writ that “affirmed in part and reversed in part” the original trial court judgment. The Court did no such thing. These words do not appear in the Court of Appeal’s opinion, nor do they appear in the new judgment issued by the trial court in either of the cases that caused the EIR to be set aside). Metro’s claim that “[t]he Draft SEIR does not reopen the underlying environmental analyses for topics such as air quality, hazards, transportation, or general noise impacts” is simply wrong. The original EIR was ordered to be set aside, opening the entirety of the environmental review process to new comments from interested agencies and members of the public. LAUSD’s comments are not late and not outside the scope of supplemental review. Metro’s failure to seriously consider LAUSD’s proffered mitigations to reduce impacts to students is outrageous and unlawful.

Likewise, comments from Councilmember Ysabel Jurado (FSEIR Errata, pp. 23-24) are also brushed aside as “Outside the Scope of the SEIR.” (*Id.*, pp. 11, 12, 14.) Councilmember Jurado raises a similar issue as the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy, the significant impact due to the Project’s elimination of so many trees in the Project area. (*Id.*, pp. 23-24; see FSEIR, Appendix A, pp. 3-4.) But Councilmember Jurado raises a *new environmental issue* no other commenter has previously discussed: “Preserv[ation] of existing mature trees is disproportionately valuable” in downtown Los Angeles, where “opportunities for planting new large canopy trees are extremely limited” due to “the density, high land value, and redevelopment pressures.” (FSEIR Errata, pp. 23-24.) Councilmember Jurado concludes that the resulting harm constitutes a significant environmental impact: “reduction of green space would harm community quality of life and urban livability.” (*Id.*, p. 24.) As with LAUSD’s comments, Metro brushes this away as both beyond the scope and adequately addressed by the previous EIR, even though it appears to be a new issue no other commenter has previously raised. (*Id.*, p. 12.)

The Conservancy’s proposed mitigation to address the loss of trees—increasing the tree replacement ratio to 10:1 and ensuring that replacement trees have minimally a five-year fully funded maintenance plan—was also dismissed out of hand by Metro with no serious consideration or analysis. (FSEIR, Appendix A, p. 3; FSEIR, pp. 88-89.) Metro

argues that the proposed mitigation is “not necessary to reduce impacts to a less-than-significant level.” (FSEIR, p. 89.) But no mitigation has been proposed to address the significant impact identified in Councilmember Jurado’s letter. The Conservancy’s proposed mitigation measure would go a long way toward addressing Councilmember Jurado’s concern. Mitigation measures should not merely reduce impacts to just enough to meet a barely less-than-significant standard when other feasible mitigations exist that provide greater environmental protection, especially for a cumulative impact such as loss of tree canopy due to dense development, as discussed in Councilmember Jurado’s letter.

Metro will now consider the Project EIR as supplemented along with related approvals at a regular board meeting on December 4, 2025, with the item placed on the *consent* calendar for agenda items that have already had public hearings. (Metro Regular Board, Dec. 4, 2025 Agenda, p. 5 [showing agenda item 16 on the consent calendar].) But the only public hearing for this consequential Project was held before the Executive Management Committee at a time that committee and the public did not have all of Metro’s responses to public comments on the Draft SEIR, including from LAUSD and Councilmember Jurado. The committee was not and *could not have been* fully informed on the decision it made to recommend the Project for approval for the full board. The committee’s action must be considered a nullity.

In addition to the reasons provided in LAPA’s October 17, 2025 letter regarding the Draft SEIR, the complete environmental record should be recirculated along with adequate responses to the LAUSD and Councilmember Jurado comment letters so the public and decisionmakers have a complete and accurate record before them before Metro takes further action on the Project.

Metro Board members have misleadingly explained Metro is only responsible for the Project’s environmental review while other agencies will approve the Project.

At the Executive Management Committee hearing on November 20, 2025,⁴ Mayor Karen Bass’s *only* comments on the Project were as follows:

1:17:05, Vice Chair/Mayor Karen Bass: Thank you, thank you, Mr. Chair, and thank you for your leadership in guiding us through this.

Just real quickly, I just wanted to reiterate, or clarify, that what the vote is about today is about certifying the EIR, certifying

the project's environmental documents under CEQA, nothing more, is that correct?

1:17:28, Chair Fernando Dutra: That is correct.

1:17:29, Mayor Bass: Thank you.

Later, Chair Fernando Dutra also disavowed Metro's responsibility for approving the Project itself, as opposed to only the environmental review for the Project:

1:27:57, Chair Dutra: My only comment is that, just to reiterate that the action taken today on the EIR, the Final supplemental EIR, uh, it is the City's [sic] of LA's land use jurisdiction just to be clear, including right-of-way issues, so the City will ultimately decide on the actual project, but I want to thank everybody for the robust discussion up here today...

Metro staff and board members have consistently disavowed responsibility for Project approval. They did so during the certification of the previously approved EIR, which included similar comments from Mayor Bass at the February 22, 2024 Metro Regular Board meeting. At that meeting, Senior Executive Officer Holly Rockwell introduced the Project by saying Metro's action would be "to approve and certify the Environmental Impact Report for the Los Angeles Aerial Rapid Transit Project."⁵ Former City Councilmember and Metro Board member Krekorian stated that "in terms of the actual land use approval of this project, that is not within the province of this agency. That is within the province of the City of Los Angeles to approve the land use considerations that are at stake here."⁶

CEQA requires the agency undertaking environmental review be responsible for Project approval. "CEQA is violated when the authority to approve or disapprove the project is separated from the responsibility to complete the environmental review." (*POET, LLC v. State Air Resources Bd.* (2013) 218 Cal.App.4th 681, 731 (*POET*), citing *Sundstrom v. County of Mendocino* (1988) 202 Cal.App.3d 296, 307 and *Kleist v. City of Glendale* (1976) 56 Cal.App.3d 770, 778-779 (*Kleist*).) Separating accountability for the environmental review from accountability for the Project is antithetical to one of the fundamental purposes of CEQA. "[T]he separation of the approval function from the review and consideration of the environmental assessment is inconsistent with the purpose served by an environmental assessment as it insulates the person or group approving the project from public awareness and the possible reaction to the individual

members' environmental and economic values.” (*POET, supra*, at 731, quoting *Kleist, supra*, at p. 779 (internal quotation marks omitted).)

Metro's continuing claims it is only responsible for the Project's environmental review as opposed to the Project itself confuses the public and deflects political accountability to other agencies, defeating CEQA's information and disclosure requirements. (See *POET, supra*, at 768, fn. 23, citing *Consolidated Irrigation Dist. v. Superior Court* (2012) 205 Cal.App.4th 697, 717: “Political accountability, informed self-government and environmental protection are promoted by the information and disclosure functions of CEQA.”) “The fundamental goals of environmental review under CEQA are information, participation, mitigation, **and accountability**. (*Lincoln Place Tenants Assn. v. City of Los Angeles* (2007) 155 Cal.App.4th 425, 443–444 (emphasis added), citing CEQA Guidelines 15002 and *Guide to CEQA, California Environmental Quality Act* (11th ed. 2006), Michael H. Remy, et al., p. 3.)

Moreover, the City of Los Angeles's official position, established by the City Council's Resolution 25-1295, is to oppose the Project.⁷ Notwithstanding the City's opposition to the Project Metro will now cause the City to have to entertain applications that will cause agency staff at multiple City agencies including Planning and Transportation to expend significant time and agency resources reviewing project applications that the City Council will reject. While application fees may partly offset the huge expense of reviewing these applications, the City will never recover the lost staff time that could have been spent on projects our communities want and need, rather than a vanity tourist project to a private sports and entertainment venue.

Based on the above reasons, among many others, the City of Los Angeles should be the lead agency, not Metro.

The proposed Findings of Fact and Statement of Overriding Considerations recommended for approval by the Executive Management Comm. are inadequate.

As this letter is being completed, Metro's Findings of Fact and Statement of Overriding Considerations document (*Findings*) associated with the December 4 agenda item 16 are not available for review because the link to the online document is not working. (Clicking on the link leads to a blank web page with the message “This record is currently unavailable.”)⁸ Based on the version of the document available to the public before the November 20, 2025, Executive Management Committee hearing for the Project, the Findings suffer from the same fatal defect as the originally approved

Findings. (This is likely because it appears to be verbatim the same document but for minor modifications of dates corrected for Metro's currently proposed action.) The document cannot be referenced as evidence herein since it is currently unavailable.

The unavailability of a critical project document provided to the agency decisionmakers, but not the public only hours before consideration of the action, is itself enough reason for the agency to hold the item over until a future board meeting so that members of the public have full access to Project documentation before Metro acts.

More important, based on a previous iteration of the Findings document, Metro appears poised to make the incorrect finding with respect to Public Resources Code section 21081 and CEQA Guidelines section 15091 for mitigation measure MM-LUP-A. Based on the lack of availability of the document and the available evidence suggesting this defect likely continues, LAPA reserves the right to raise this objection in future legal proceedings to the extent the record continues to reflect Metro did not make the required CEQA findings.

The Supplemental Wildland Fire Hazard Assessment was not provided in the Draft SEIR, and no copy was available for review before November 20, 2025 or later.

The Final SEIR mentions a new report from REAX Engineering entitled "Supplemental Wildland Fire Hazard Assessment" (*REAX Report*) prepared in November for the Final SEIR. The report is not itself part of the Final SEIR, is not found in the FSEIR appendices, and until very recently (no earlier than November 20, 2025) was not part of Metro's SB 44 online record for the Project.⁹ There is no indication in the SB 44 online record when the document was uploaded to that website.

On December 3, 2025, while preparing this submission, the author once again searched the SB 44 online record for the Project and discovered the document is now part of the online record.¹⁰ It was not available at the website when the website was last checked on November 19, 2025. The SB 44 web page provides no indication when the document was uploaded and available for public review.

Commenters on the Draft SEIR had no opportunity to review or comment on the contents of the REAX Report in their written comments to Metro. First, one would have to know that the document even exists to comment on it, but second, a copy would have to be available for review for that to happen. But the document was not referenced in the DSEIR. The first reference to the document is in the Final SEIR. (FSEIR, p. 67.) The

FSEIR reference notes only that the document was prepared in November and does not provide the specific date it was prepared or submitted to Metro.

The first page of the REAX Report indicates it was prepared on November 13, 2025. This is the same date as the deadline for DSEIR comments. Even if provided on that day to the public, this was insufficient for members of the public to evaluate a technical document prepared by an expert and provide comment without an opportunity to first consult with their own independent expert(s). It is unknown when the report was received by Metro. It is unknown whether it was available to the Executive Management Committee before they considered the Project at their November 20, 2025 meeting.

As the end of 2025 approaches, there are few more salient concerns to Angelenos than the increased risks of wildfire brought about by global climate change with attendant changes in local weather patterns, such as the extraordinarily high winds that drove the devastation of the Palisades and Eaton Fires in January 2025. The hillside areas through which the Project's gondola cars will travel are subject to occasional, sometimes even frequent fires. Metro's lack of disclosure that a new wildland hazard report was even being considered and the failure to timely provide it to members of the public and decisionmakers demands recirculation and a reasonable opportunity for public comment on potentially increased risk of wildfire due to the Project.

Conclusion.

LAPA joins all those who urge Metro to set aside the February 2024 EIR and related approvals as ordered by the Court of Appeals and in the recently issued judgments and writs effectuating the Court's decision. These include more than 10,000 local petition signatories, twelve members of the Los Angeles City Council who set the official policy of the City of Los Angeles in opposition to the Project, and the many hundreds of commenters to the Draft and Final SEIR documents now being considered by Metro. Metro should not recertify the inadequate EIR or make any related approvals.

Alternately, Metro may set aside the EIR and transfer the responsibility of lead agency to the City of Los Angeles and take on the role of responsible agency if the City of Los Angeles determines to proceed with the Project, so that the City's many concerns are no longer ignored.

LA Aerial Rapid Transit Technologies LLC is proposing the Los Angeles Aerial Rapid Transit Project, which would connect Los Angeles Union Station to the Dodger Stadium property with an intermediate station at the Los Angeles State Historic Park via a zero-emission aerial rapid transit gondola system in downtown Los Angeles. Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) is the lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and has prepared a Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (Final SEIR).

In early 2024, Metro certified the Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) for the Los Angeles Aerial Rapid Transit Project. However, following litigation, the Court of Appeal directed Metro to prepare a SEIR to address temporary construction noise mitigation issues. The Draft SEIR was released for a 45-day public comment period beginning on September 29, 2025, and ending on November 13, 2025.

RESOLUTION RULES, ELECTIONS, AND
INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS

WHEREAS, any official position of the City of Los Angeles with respect to legislation, rules, regulations, or policies proposed to or pending before a local, state or federal governmental body or agency must first be adopted in the form of a Resolution by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Los Angeles Aerial Rapid Transit (LA ART) project, commonly referred to as the "Gondola," is a private, unfunded, \$500 million aerial transportation project initiated in 2018 and spearheaded by Frank McCourt, former owner of the Los Angeles Dodgers and current part-owner of the stadium's parking lot, aimed to connect Dodger Stadium to Union Station along a 1.2 mile route passing through Chinatown and the Los Angeles State Historic Park, located primarily in Council District 1; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project consists of overhead cables, three passenger stations, a non-passenger junction, multiple towers, and gondola cabins that would encroach upon public open space, fly as low as 40 feet above homes and businesses in Chinatown and 26 feet above the State Historic Park, and significantly alter the quality of life of residents; and

WHEREAS, a study conducted by the UCLA Mobility Lab found that total traffic volume surrounding Dodger Stadium would decrease only by 0.9%, equivalent to approximately 608 fewer cars, and would be less cost-effective for ticket holders compared to other public transportation options such as the Metro bus service; and

WHEREAS, the project would permanently remove more than 160 trees, eliminate 9,320 square feet of tree canopy cover and 2,195 square feet of public park property, and disturb local natural habitats, causing permanent environmental degradation in one of the City's most park-poor neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, the project has faced widespread opposition from Chinatown and Solano Canyon residents, Neighborhood Councils, environmental organizations, and community-based groups, who have expressed concerns about the project's impacts, including noise, visual blight, and environmental injustice, on residents living directly beneath the proposed Gondola route, as well as on community members that work, serve, and visit these neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, the majority of the census tracts within the project footprint rank within the top 5% of disadvantaged communities statewide, including three census tracts with a high concentration of older adults, ranging between 16.5% and 28%. The proposed project would run directly next to the Chinatown Metro Apartments, a covenanted affordable housing project composed of 122 units for low and very low income seniors; and

WHEREAS, according to the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment, the majority of the census tracts within the project footprint area are ranked among the top 5% of areas in the State with the highest pollution burden and exposure to diesel particulate matter, meaning these communities are more likely to develop serious health problems and face a disproportionate burden of environmental hazards; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) guidelines, the Gondola was required to undergo an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) due to its potentially significant environmental effects on the surrounding area; and

WHEREAS, under the California Public Utilities Code and CEQA, the Los Angeles County (County) Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) serves as the designated lead agency responsible for reviewing mass transit projects in the County, including approving all plans related to the design, construction, and implementation of the project; and

WHEREAS, on December 4, 2023, the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) released the Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) for the LA ART project, advancing the proposal toward certification despite widespread community opposition and concerns regarding the cumulative environmental impacts; and

WHEREAS, the FEIR inadequately addressed the construction noise impacts and failed to consult with the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy, but was nonetheless certified by Metro on February 22, 2024; and

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2024, the Los Angeles Park Alliance filed a lawsuit challenging Metro's approval of the EIR and called for the California State Court of Appeals to reverse certification of the LA ART's EIR; and

WHEREAS, on April 5, 2024, the Council adopted a Motion (Hernandez - Soto-Martinez - Rodriguez), Council File 24-0011-S4, authorizing the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) to commission a comprehensive traffic assessment of the "community impact zones" around Dodger Stadium and to preclude the City from issuing permit clearances, entitlements, land use changes, or general plan amendments for the LA ART project until completion of the study; and

WHEREAS, on May 1, 2025, the California State Court of Appeals challenged Metro's approval of the environmental review, reaffirming the public's concerns over the FEIR and requiring a supplemental EIR; and

WHEREAS, on August 13, 2025, the Council adopted a Resolution (Hernandez - Jurado), Council File 25-0002-S31, opposing Section 3 of Senate Bill 71 (Wiener), which sought to extend CEQA exemptions for qualifying transportation projects, including the LA ART project, and to limit any legal challenge under state and local law to a 12-month period; and

WHEREAS, on September 29, 2025, Metro released the Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (DSEIR) for the LA ART project, initiating a 45-day public comment period concluding on November 13, 2025 and will hold only one virtual public comment hearing, held prospectively on November 6, 2025; and

WHEREAS, on October 10, 2025, the Council adopted a Planning and Land Use Management (PLUM) Committee report and accompanying Ordinance, Council File 15-0989-S47, to expedite the development of projects supporting the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games. While this report and Ordinance provided streamlining benefits for certain projects, it explicitly excluded "large-scale cable-guided transportation projects or aerial mobility projects," ensuring that the LA ART project would not be eligible for any expedited approvals; and

WHEREAS, Council District 1 submitted a letter to Metro calling for a 45-day extension, an in-person public hearing, and the establishment of a dedicated toll-free line to ensure greater community access and participation and upon analyzing the SEIR and decertified FEIR, the unavoidable and un-mitigatable project impacts due to noise during construction, the impact on the natural environment in a park poor community, impacts to a disadvantaged community's quality of life are not worth the project; and

WHEREAS, following the close of the public comment period on November 13, 2025, the Metro Board will consider the DSEIR and determine whether to certify the Final EIR based on the findings contained in the supplemental report;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that by adoption of this Resolution, the City of Los Angeles hereby OPPOSES the Los Angeles Aerial Rapid Transit (LA ART) project, and URGES the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro), in its consideration of the Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the LA ART, dated September 25, 2025, to OPPOSE the readoption of the FEIR Findings and the Statement of Overriding Considerations for the LA ART project, and DENY reapproval of the project.

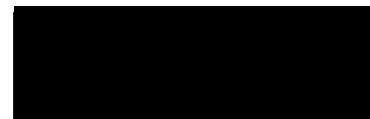

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Hello LA Metro. My name is Faraz, I'm a resident of Downey who uses LA Metro buses and trains daily, and I oppose the approval of the SEIR and the Dodgers Gondola project.

I do not approve of how rushed (railroading) this community engagement process has been regarding the SEIR. There was only 1 Public Hearing (with no in-person opportunity for those wanting to give public comments in-person and for those who aren't tech savvy) and not everyone may have been available attend on that day at 5pm. But even so, that public hearing had so many public commenters, that they had to extend the meeting beyond the original end time. Public commenters were only given less than 24-hrs to read over the release of the Final SEIR just before the Nov 20th Executive Committee Meeting. Not to mention how rushed the Nov 20th Executive Committee meeting was forcing everyone to speak within 30 seconds and only limiting total public comment to 1 hour. Again, this all feels very rushed/railroading like LA Metro doesn't want to hear from the public.

Regarding the public commenters I've been hearing, those within LA Chinatown (especially Mandarin/Cantonese speakers) are against the Gondola project. But it appears those showing up saying they support the Gondola project are mostly from San Fernando Valley and the group has mentioned in past meetings that they were given Dodger tickets to show up to say they support the Gondola project. Not to mention many of those public commenters supporting the gondola who do not take public transportation will have to park either at Union Station or at the Chinatown Gondola Station (which means this will make traffic at Chinatown much worse since you're just moving portions of Dodger Stadium car traffic next to the gondolas stations). And for the few saying they would take Metrolink to a gondola station, they either don't know what they're talking about or do not use Metrolink, because I know that Metrolink has poor frequencies and once it becomes night time or the weekends, it starts cutting/ending service. Just recently in this year's Dodgers World Series 18-inning game (Game 3), that game went all the way to midnight where both LA Metro & Metrolink train service ended for the night. But while LA Metro was kind enough to extend their service until Dodgers fans left the stadium, those who took Metrolink would have been stranded (since Metrolink refused to extend service). Just something I want LA Metro to keep in mind when you hear those who say they'll take Metrolink to the Gondola station.

But my main reason why I oppose this project is because I want LA Metro to focus on better public transportation to the Dodger Stadium such as better Dodger Express bus frequencies, bus lanes, building a much easier (and less sketchy) pedestrian access way connecting the east side of the Stadium to LA State Historic Park/A (Blue) Line Chinatown train station, and to ultimately build an underground train connecting Union Station with Dodger Stadium via an extension from the Southeast Gateway rail line (trains are the best transportation option that can actually help lessen car traffic in Chinatown).

I am also against the taking away LA State Historic Park space from residents. As much as the project claims it will make this up by planting more trees, it can never make up for the loss space that the community had been fighting for many years and it's a much needed park space (since that area is a very industrialized area with almost no other park space available to local residents).

And lastly, the projected 5,000 riders per an hour per direction is an over estimation because it over

estimates that 30 to 40 riders will enter and exit the cabins with no delays at 23 seconds consistently. Plus there will be waiting queues of over 1 hour just to get into a gondola cabin (especially after a game when there is a rush of attendees leaving).

Please listen to Metro Board member Janice Hahn and the LA City Council who have already voted to disapprove the Final SEIR and have mentioned how they disapprove of the Gondola project. But either way, without LA City Council's approval on land use/permits, this project will be dead in the water, so it will be interesting to see how each LA Metro Board will vote on this to see if they are on the side of the people of Chinatown (and what's left of Chavez Ravine), or on the side of Frank McCourt and those wanting the weakest form of public transit to/from Dodger Stadium (even though we LA County residents deserve public transit much better than a gondola). Again, there are much better transportation alternatives for people like us who want to take public transit to and from Dodger Stadium (improving buses, underground trains, and better pedestrian access).

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Dear Metro Board Members and Staff,

Almost exactly 2 weeks ago, I was sent the email in the forward below at 3:25 pm announcing the release of the FSEIR for the LA ART Gondola project. It arrived in my inbox approximately 1.5 hours before the written public comment deadline for Metro's 11/20 Executive Committee meeting. The deadline for written comment for that meeting was on 5pm on 11/19. Also, because I was at my work site that day, managing movers, I did not see this email until after the deadline for written public comment had passed. I had no idea that the FSEIR was going to be released that day. When I saw the meeting agenda previously, it listed the document, but did not provide a link to the document. Did you, the Metro Board members or your staff have advanced notice as to when the FSEIR would be published, so that you could use that 1.5 hours before leaving the office that day to read the FSEIR, and then go home to eat and sleep?

Either way, less than 2 hours was not enough for me to review the FSEIR and also write a comment letter that afternoon, before the 5pm deadline, to the Metro board to express my concerns about the document and the project developer's responses to comments — not just mine, but others' as well. My main comment letter, which was written on behalf of myself and other neighbors on Savoy Street, was detailed, 12 pages long, and offered critiques of the noise studies, the use of a 1927 home to model the noise impacts in a neighborhood with many homes from the 1800's, and suggestions for noise mitigation.

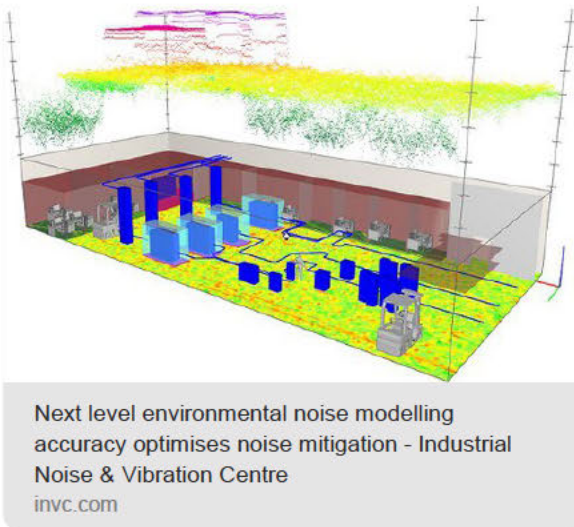
Can you please, before the 5pm deadline today, read my letter (from "Savoy Street Neighbors") as published in the FSEIR, and read the entire FSEIR and tell me why all of my suggestions were dismissed, including my request for contour map studies of the construction noise? If you receive my email now, you will have almost an hour more than I was given to review the FSEIR before the written comment deadline on 11/19. (And actually, you would have infinitely more time than I had because I was not given advanced notice that the FSEIR would be published that day.)

I noticed at least another comment letter requested contour maps for the construction noise. Although Metro and LA ART contend that none of the issues raised by commenters would change their construction noise mitigation plan, contour noise maps or spatial maps to show the propagation of noise in our neighborhood would be an important tool for residents when deciding how to cope with the unmitigated construction noise. For example, haven't you ever awoken to a

loud voice or a leaf blower, and sworn it was coming from behind your home, but then learned that the sound was coming from the exact opposite side of the house, that the noise you were hearing was reflecting off of another building or a wall? If you were going to be faced with months of unavoidable and unhealthy construction noise pollution, wouldn't you want to know if you were wasting your time trying to relocate your home office or a baby's nursery to the another room in your house? This is important information for the public and for decision makers, especially if you're considering a business interruption fund or other "conditions of approval" for the project.

Noise doesn't just travel in straight lines. It can reflect, propagate, etc., especially in urban environments. LAART's and Metro's contention that it's better just to take point measurements using point sources, and get the worst case measurement seems like a shortcut that ignores the fact that we as residents don't live in only one part of a home, and we might try to cope with or lessen the impact of the unmitigated construction noise by spending more time in what might be a quieter section of a home. If Metro refuses to deny approval of this project — even after LA ART has missed every deadline to provide a funding plan, and even after they have failed to comply with the conditions of approval from February 22, 2024 — then I, as well as others, are asking for information we can use to help us cope with the noise impacts within our own homes. Is that too much to ask?

In case I am not making myself clear about the noise contour maps, or not using the correct term of art, please see below:



I'm also urging Metro to open up public comment for Item #16 at the December 4th, 2025 board meeting, which is currently on the Consent Calendar. Mayor Bass and Chair Dutra stated incorrectly at the November 20, 2025 Executive Management Committee meeting that they were only voting on the EIR certification, and nothing more. If that's the case, then why is the project approval also on the Consent Calendar for the December 4th meeting? Also, the Final SEIR Errata was not released until several days after the Executive Committee meeting. No public comment was heard in committee about that document. Is it appropriate and legal to add approval of the FSEIR Errata to the Consent Calendar?

LA Aerial Rapid Transit Technologies LLC is proposing the Los Angeles Aerial Rapid Transit Project, which would connect Los Angeles Union Station to the Dodger Stadium property with an intermediate station at the Los Angeles State Historic Park via a zero-emission aerial rapid transit gondola system in downtown Los Angeles. Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) is the lead agency under the California

Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and has prepared a Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (Final SEIR).

In early 2024, Metro certified the Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) for the Los Angeles Aerial Rapid Transit Project. However, following litigation, the Court of Appeal directed Metro to prepare a SEIR to address temporary construction noise mitigation issues. The Draft SEIR was released for a 45-day public comment period beginning on September 29, 2025, and ending on November 13, 2025.

The Final SEIR is now available. This milestone document compiles and responds to all comments received during the Draft SEIR public review period.

The Final SEIR is available [here](#) and is also available in hard copy at the Central Library, Chinatown Branch Library, Cypress Park Branch Library, and Metro Headquarters, Dorothy Peyton Grey Library.

Metro held an Informational Workshop on October 9, 2025, to inform the public of the key analyses and conclusions of the Draft SEIR and a Public Hearing on November 6, 2025, to receive comments on the Draft SEIR. 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Dear Metro Board Members & Staff,

I am a resident by the proposed LA ART gondola project, former Historic Cultural North Neighborhood Council Chair, and founder of Stop The Gondola.

The LA ART Gondola project would do little to take cars off the road. It would mostly shift more car traffic to Union Station and Chinatown/LA State Historic Park, by the gondola stations. The VMT reductions claimed by this project in the Final EIR are vastly overstated and based on old, outdated, and limited 2014 survey of DSE riders.

From the August 2025 Metro Chief Operating Officer's Monthly Report - "DSE Union Station riders arrived Union Station by car (60%), Metro Rail & Bus (mostly A and B/D) (26%) and by Regional Rail (5%)." (See attachments). COO Report available here: <https://metro.legistar1.com/metro/attachments/653f4ef1-dd28-41f9-9e2a-5faf21faf04e.pdf>

This is vastly different than LA ART's claim that 68% of gondola riders would take transit for their entire trip, with an average trip of 22 miles. Even if the decision makers aren't going to order a new EIR, they should acknowledge that the analysis in the EIR is based on outdated information, and does not reflect current, real world conditions. The transit utility and benefits of this project are speculative at best. The gondola is a private tourist attraction

and shuttle to a private property and sports venue. It still has no funding plan, and is asking to occupy our public land and airspace.

Are the conditions of approval from February 22, 2024 even being upheld? One of the conditions was that ZET/Metro provide quarterly updates to the Metro Board on the project's progress and financing. I have requested those records, but have been met with delays in fulfilling this CPRA request. I'm now being told that the records may not be produced until December 5, 2024. This is conveniently the day after Metro's next board meeting, at which it is expected that the LA ART Gondola will be on the agenda for reapproval of the project and EIR. There has been no accountability with this project.

A lot has changed in the two years since Metro voted hastily to approve the project with a long list of conditions. This is not even counting the Court of Appeal decision that ordered Metro to set aside the previous project and EIR approvals.

- Neighborhood councils have come out against this project, including Historic Cultural North, Lincoln Heights, Echo Park, and Elysian Valley Riverside NCs.
- Last week, the LA City Council voted 12 to 1 to urge Metro to deny approval and reject the SEIR/EIR for the gondola project.
- In March, 2024, the LA City Council approved a traffic study for Dodger Stadium to study alternatives to alleviate traffic.
- A new U.S. President is in office, casting huge levels of doubt and uncertainty regarding the federal government's commitment to funding basic transportation needs for the Olympics. (buses).
- The Palisades and Eaton fires, plus the ICE mass deportation actions have added to the shortage of available construction workers. Who would even build the gondola?
- With less than 1000 days to go, and construction and testing of the gondola project estimated to take 25 months, and all of the other approvals needed from the City of LA and CA State Parks, there is no chance the gondola could be completed in time for the Olympics.
- LA City, LA County, and CA State are in budget crises.

And more!

This project as a whole is an ill-conceived, unfunded, boondoggle, and our city, county, and state are in no position to take on this level of risk. An insurance policy (does it even exist?) is meaningless. Once the trees are cut down, they're gone. If the towers and stations are built, nothing will undo the unmitigated construction noise that destroys Olvera Street businesses and harms the health and well being of adjacent residents. The years of road closures and construction blight in the historic heart of the City of LA can't be undone.

Metro needs to end this project now and stop it from flushing the reputation of this public transit agency down the toilet. We're not in a hurry now to get this done for Olympics. We've had time to look at the project more closely. We know better and must do better.

I urge you to vote a resounding NO on any and all approvals for this project, including the Project SEIR.

Metro met with the Dodgers twice (Aug. 12 and Sept. 23)

- Discussions on Dodger Stadium Express (DSE) included:

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I am a long-time Dodger fan who is consistently stuck in traffic going to the game. The gondola is not a solution to any problem – and a cost-benefit examination should make that clear. The city may not care if a private company is going to spend \$500M to build this gondola, but it should care about being a potentially worthless solution to a real problem.

Every news account says the gondola can move 5000 people per hour. Dodger Stadium's capacity is 50000 (fifty thousand). On average, with the new pitch clock rules, a baseball game now lasts 2.5 hours. So let's say, optimistically, 7500 people use the gondola. Is someone going to potentially wait 90 minutes to get to Dodger Stadium, and 90 minutes to get back? That's longer than the game itself!

This doesn't even take into account the cost of using the gondola. Let's say it is \$20/person, which is a number I've seen in news reports. So for a family of 4 to take the gondola, that's \$160 per round trip? Compared to the Dodger Stadium Express or non-reserved parking in a Dodger Stadium parking lot. How does this meet a positive cost-benefit analysis?

Dodger Stadium is in use for baseball 81 home games per year. Add in another 10-12 dates if the Dodgers get all the way to the World Series – that's 93 dates per year.

I think this gondola will have very little utility when examining a cost-benefit of the operation. If the City of Los Angeles cares about building things that are useful (even if the bill is entirely footed by a private company), this just doesn't seem to make sense.

And I write this as an enormous Dodger fan.

There happens to be a far cheaper, less disruptive, faster, more equitable solution to the traffic and safety problems in our neighborhoods and it is buses and bus lanes!

We don't even have a safe way for people to walk from metro stations to dodger stadium which should be a much bigger priority for the city. A dedicated bus / bike lane would be invaluable on game days and for commutes. It would help to increase safety by reducing the speed of cars. Increasing bus transit opportunities near stadiums is vital especially given the great example of the Hollywood Bowl.

Once we can do this, we could even free up some of the acres of parking lot with Elysian Park for housing or more park amenities.

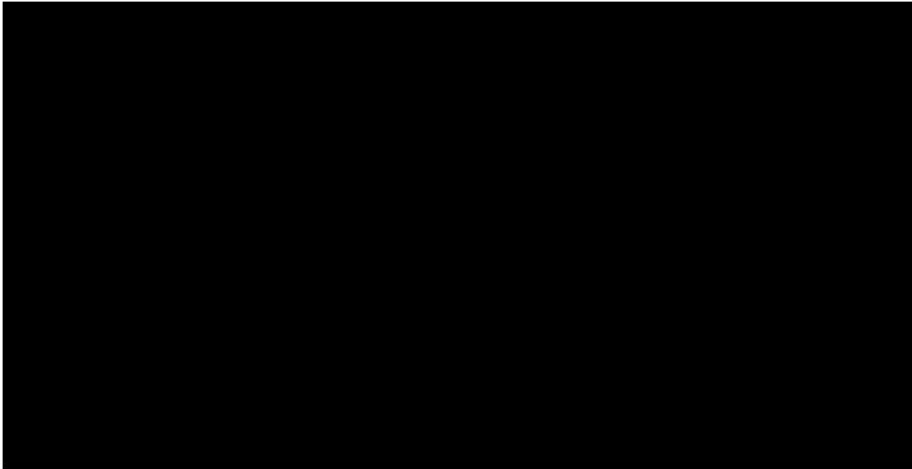

Dear Metro Board Members and Staff,

Almost exactly 2 weeks ago, I was sent the email in the forward below at 3:25 pm announcing the release of the FSEIR for the LA ART Gondola project. It arrived in my inbox approximately 1.5 hours before the written public comment deadline for Metro's 11/20 Executive Committee meeting. The deadline for written comment for that meeting was on 5pm on 11/19. Also, because I was at my work site that day, managing movers, I did not see this email until after the deadline for written public comment had passed. I had no idea that the FSEIR was going to be released that day. When I saw the meeting agenda previously, it listed the document, but did not provide a link to the document. Did you, the Metro Board members or your staff have advanced notice as to when the FSEIR would be published, so that you could use that 1.5 hours before leaving the office that day to read the FSEIR, and then go home to eat and sleep?

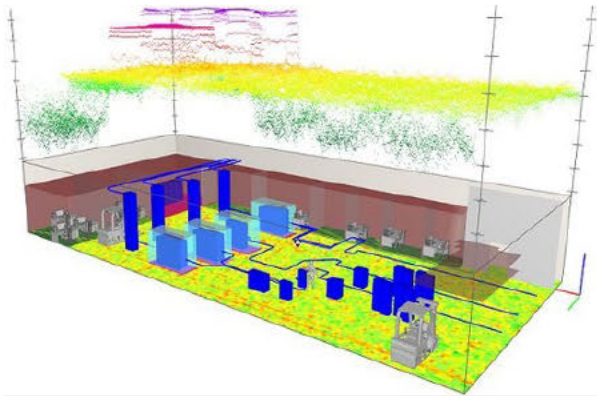
Either way, less than 2 hours was not enough for me to review the FSEIR and also write a comment letter that afternoon, before the 5pm deadline, to the Metro board to express my concerns about the document and the project developer's responses to comments — not just mine, but others' as well. My main comment letter, which was written on behalf of myself and other neighbors on Savoy Street, was detailed, 12 pages long, and offered critiques of the noise studies, the use of a 1927 home to model the noise impacts in a neighborhood with many homes from the 1800's, and suggestions for noise mitigation.

Can you please, before the 5pm deadline today, read my letter (from "Savoy Street Neighbors") as published in the FSEIR, and read the entire FSEIR and tell me why all of my suggestions were dismissed, including my request for contour map studies of the construction noise? If you receive my email now, you will have almost an hour more than I was given to review the FSEIR before the written comment deadline on 11/19. (And actually, you would have infinitely more time than I had because I was not given advanced notice that the FSEIR would be published that day.)

I noticed at least another comment letter requested contour maps for the construction noise. Although Metro and LA ART contend that none of the issues raised by commenters would change their construction noise mitigation plan, contour noise maps or spatial maps to show the propagation of noise in our neighborhood would be an important tool for residents when deciding how to cope with the unmitigated construction noise. For example, haven't you ever awoken to a loud voice or a leaf blower, and sworn it was coming from behind your home, but then learned that the sound was coming from the exact opposite side of the house, that the noise you were hearing was reflecting off of another building or a wall? If you were going to be faced with months of unavoidable and unhealthy construction noise pollution, wouldn't you want to know if you were wasting your time trying to relocate your home office or a baby's nursery to the another room in your house? This is important information for the public and for decision makers, especially if you're considering a business interruption fund or other "conditions of approval" for the project.

Noise doesn't just travel in straight lines. It can reflect, propagate, etc., especially in urban environments. LAART's and Metro's contention that it's better just to take point measurements using point sources, and get the worst case measurement seems like a shortcut that ignores the fact that we as residents don't live in only one part of a home, and we might try to cope with or lessen the impact of the unmitigated construction noise by spending more time in what might be a quieter section of a home. If Metro refuses to deny approval of this project — even after LA ART has missed every deadline to provide a funding plan, and even after they have failed to comply with the conditions of approval from February 22, 2024 — then I, as well as others, are asking for information we can use to help us cope with the noise impacts within our own homes. Is that too much to ask?

In case I am not making myself clear about the noise contour maps, or not using the correct term of art, please see below:

I'm also urging Metro to open up public comment for Item #16 at the December 4th, 2025 board meeting, which is currently on the Consent Calendar. Mayor Bass and Chair Dutra stated incorrectly at the November 20, 2025 Executive Management Committee meeting that they were only voting on the EIR certification, and nothing more. If that's the case, then why is the project approval also on the Consent Calendar for the December 4th meeting? Also, the Final SEIR Errata was not released until several days after the Executive Committee meeting. No public comment was heard in committee about that document. Is it appropriate and legal to add approval of the FSEIR Errata to the Consent Calendar?

LA Aerial Rapid Transit Technologies LLC is proposing the Los Angeles Aerial Rapid Transit Project, which would connect Los Angeles Union Station to the Dodger Stadium property with an intermediate station at the Los Angeles State Historic Park via a zero-emission aerial rapid transit gondola system in downtown Los Angeles. Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) is the lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and has prepared a Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (Final SEIR).

In early 2024, Metro certified the Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) for the Los Angeles Aerial Rapid Transit Project. However, following litigation, the Court of Appeal directed Metro to prepare a SEIR to address temporary construction noise mitigation issues. The Draft SEIR was released for a 45-day public comment period beginning on September 29, 2025, and ending on November 13, 2025.

The Final SEIR is now available. This milestone document compiles and responds to all comments received during the Draft SEIR public review period.

The Final SEIR is available [here](#) and is also available in hard copy at the Central Library, Chinatown Branch Library, Cypress Park Branch Library, and Metro Headquarters, Dorothy Peyton Grey Library.

Metro held an Informational Workshop on October 9, 2025, to inform the public of the key analyses and conclusions of the Draft SEIR and a Public Hearing on November 6,

Please find attached the COO presentation from Metro's Committee meeting on October 16, 2025, which includes updated information on the Dodger Stadium Express on slides 7 through 8.

Unfortunately the FEIR for the LA ART Gondola project claims VMT reductions based on bad assumptions and outdated information, primarily a Dodger Stadium Express survey from 2014. In that survey, 75% of DSE riders reported taking transit for their journey to access the DSE. LA ART claims that 68% of gondola riders will do the same, simply by discounting the 75% number in the 2014 survey by ten percent. According to the COO's report last month, 60% of riders for the DSE arrived at Union Station by car.

This is just another example of the bad assumptions that underlie the flawed EIR for the LA ART Gondola.

Dodger Stadium Express

Metro met with the Dodgers twice (Aug. 12 and Sept. 23)

- Discussions on Dodger Stadium Express (DSE) included:
 - Operational Costs
 - Sponsorship Revenue Sharing Options
 - The fan journey, operational improvements, and enhanced wayfinding in and around Dodger Stadium
- Conversations with the Dodgers are ongoing and Metro is developing a schedule for additional meetings.

Dodger Stadium Express (DSE) Operations:

- Dodgers took action in response to Metro request to relocate Dodger Stadium Rideshare Lot, removing a major bottleneck for DSE buses entering the stadium after games, reducing rider wait times.
- Discussions with LADOT indicate implementing a bus lane on Sunset Bl eastbound after games may delay buses overall from traffic impacts.
- 2025 season saw record ridership for Union Station DSE of 335,789 (up 26.9%). South Bay DSE also increased by 1.5%.
 - Union Station DSE saw 61% repeat riders and 39% new riders
 - DSE Union Station riders arrived Union Station by car (60%), Metro Rail & Bus (mostly A and B/D) (26%) and by Regional Rail (5%).





RE: General Comments on Item 30 – Zero-Emission Bus (ZEB) Program Update

Dear Chair Dutra and Members of the Board:

We are writing to you as the Los Angeles County Electric Truck and Bus Coalition (LACETBC) to express serious concerns about the Zero-Emission Bus Program Update. Our coalition is composed of climate, environmental justice, and labor advocates including Earthjustice, Sierra Club, Jobs to Move America, East Yard Communities for Environmental Justice, and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 11. Our coalition is committed to achieving zero emission electric bus and truck adoption with robust workforce standards so that our communities can breathe clean air and enjoy family- sustaining, high-wage careers.

I. The Current ZEB Program Approach Lacks Ambition.

The current approach by Metro staff continues a general lack of ambition on zero-emission bus deployments. In the eight years since Metro made the landmark decision to commit to 100% zero-emission buses by 2030, the agency has deployed 4.8% of its bus fleet as zero- emissions. It will take two and a half centuries to fully electrify our fleet at this rate. We recognize that any large-scale technology change will encounter challenges, but implementation has been too slow given the benefits of this conversion.

II. The Metro Board Must Provide More Direction on the Re-Release of RFP.

The current proposal has Metro re-releasing the Request for Proposals at an undesignated future date. The report only states that staff intend to update technical specs and re- release the RFP, but it provides no timeline for doing so and fails to explain why technical specs have not been updated in the months since the last RFP closed. Notably, the report states that the two proposals submitted in March 2025 did not meet scheduling requirements to ensure a maximum number of buses delivered before the Games. Yet with no timeline for when the upcoming RFP will be re-released, it

is unclear how staff can also contend that its chosen approach will exceed Metro's near-term goal of 256 ZEBs by the end of 2028—a goal that was already unambitious.

The Metro Board must demand that staff pursue this new RFP no later than December 31st, 2025, to minimize further delays to our transit electrification goals. In addition to providing a concrete timeline, the re-released RFP's base order and options should be no less than the previous RFP, which was the largest solicitation for ZEBs in U.S. history. We are pleased to hear that Metro's industry outreach indicates that there are additional transit bus manufacturers that can provide ZEBs, meaning Metro will likely receive more proposals on the procurement re-release. But given that the previous RFP received only two proposals, Metro should ensure the re-released RFP is large enough to attract new manufacturers to the region and compensate for delays from the unfulfilled solicitation.

III. Construction of Charging Needs to Be Hastened.

We also continue to be deeply concerned about the pace of construction on charging facilities. While Metro has done great work electrifying divisions within Southern California Edison territory and installing en route charging in the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) territories, electrification of LADWP divisions continues to lag behind. This lack of progress is particularly concerning given previous ZEB Program Updates stating that the Games Enhanced Transit Services (GETS), as well as the property leases and investments to support the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games, provide a unique opportunity to rapidly advance electrification without disruption. Yet Metro staff continues to kick the can down the road, and our window of opportunity is rapidly closing with seemingly no justification.

Metro has continuously emphasized the need for the upcoming 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games to leave legacy benefits for Angelenos. Metro can and must meet this moment and ensure those benefits come to fruition with a forward-looking and bold plan to electrify our transit buses. **That means deploying at least 1,175 electric transit buses and electrifying seven Metro divisions by the 2028 Games.** Metro must catalyze increased electric bus deployments so we can get ZEBs on the road, build the infrastructure we need to support the transition, create good manufacturing jobs, and foster community benefits for the Los Angeles region. We can do all of this and still provide reliable bus service.

We look forward to working with you on this effort and continuing to be engaged.
