

Recommendation: Receive & File Status Update

Project Overview

- Extends the K Line north from E to B Line with underground tunnels (6 to 10 miles)
- Closes gap in regional transit network and connects 4 Metro Rail lines and major bus lines
- Serves and connects historically under-served communities to job, schools, medical centers

Status

- Released Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) and received comments during 60-day public comment period (July 23 – September 20, 2024)
- Completed technical studies in response to comments from Mid-City residents on Draft EIR, per Metro Board direction (October 31, 2024)



Concerns from Mid-City Residents on Draft EIR

During the 2024 Draft EIR public comment period, Metro received comments from residents of historic Mid-City neighborhoods, specifically Wellington Square and Lafayette Square related to:

- Opposition to single Draft EIR tunnel alignment in historic Mid-City neighborhoods and request to engage community and explore alternate alignment options to minimize tunnel easements below homes
- Tunnel safety concerns related to potential building damage from subway construction and operations
- Property values and property right concerns

Community Engagement Approach & Next Steps

We continue to collaborate with local community members about the best ways to notify and engage community members as we share findings.
